Criminal Enforcement: June brought us a higher number of investigations than the previous month, having investigated 75 cases and 21 of those cases were closed by immediate arrest. 6 OWI arrests, 6 thefts, 2 auto thefts, 1 burglary, 4 possession marijuana, 1 possession of methamphetamine, 1 habitual traffic violator, 1 attempted suicide, 4 CHINS, 1 domestic battery, 1 resisting law enforcement, 2 fraud and 11

warrant arrests. We continue to investigate several cases from this and previous months. As always, we wish to remind everyone that there are still many scams or attempts. Always know who you are dealing with and never give out pertinent information over the phone.

Traffic Enforcement: In June officers investigated 12 vehicle crashes of these, 1 resulted in personal injury and 1 was leaving the scene. Officers issued 56 traffic citations, addressing speed, signal and sign violations. There were 11 of our citations that were for driving while license suspended or never receiving a license. They also issued 5 written warning tickets. As always, please drive defensively and never text and drive. Always wear safety restraints properly – **THEY DO SAVE LIVES.**
