Criminal Enforcement: July brought us a number of investigations, having investigated 60 cases and 9 of those cases were closed by immediate arrest. 1 OWI arrests, 4 thefts, 3 possession marijuana, 1 possession of methamphetamine and 6 warrant arrests. We also investigated 1 CHINS cases. We continue to investigate several cases from this and previous months. As always, we wish to remind everyone that there are still many scams or attempts. Always know who you are dealing with and never give out pertinent information over the phone.

Traffic Enforcement: In July officers investigated 15 vehicle crashes of these 1 resulted in injury and 1 leaving the scene. Officers issued 47 traffic citations, addressing speed, signal and sign violations. There were 11 of our citations that were for driving while license suspended or never receiving a license. They also issued 10 written warning tickets. As always, please drive defensively and never text and drive. Always wear safety restraints properly – **THEY DO SAVE LIVES.**
