Owner Ann Andre has sold the Murphy Guest House Bed and Breakfast which will become a private home. Debra and her husband had spent several weekends here, and their daughter had wanted to as well, but this tea was the last chance to enjoy a visit here. Ann served blueberry-raspberry scones, her signature lavender bread with lemon curd and Devonshire cream with Chocolate Carmel and Marseille Chive Tea. The soup was Italian Wedding with chicken salad, ham salad and cucumber finger sandwiches. The salad was mixed greens, dried cherries, goat cheese and Marie's white balsamic shallot vinaigrette dressing with a Mexican quiche. Dessert was raspberry cheesecake, white peanut butter fudge, blackberry thumb cookies, banana blonde brownies, strawberries dipped in chocolate and chocolate mousse.
